


## D.A.R.E. Program

## K9 Program

We have fabulous news: Our Walla Walla County Sheriff's Office is putting a **NEW K9 team** together. This new team starts training in April of 2017. The deputy will train for over 600 hours with his new dog in patrol and narcotic detection skills. This news is so fresh we don't even know the name of our new dog at the time of printing our newsletter 😊

Patrol training includes training in evidence, area and building searches, vehicle stops and criminal apprehensions.

Narcotic detection training includes detecting the presence of controlled substances such as Cocaine, Heroin and Methamphetamines.

We are planning a welcoming party for this new team later this year. We know Walla Walla Valley will welcome this team with open arms as we did back in 2012 for our other team.

## From the Sheriff...

*Our Sheriff's Office had a successful 2016 with several major cases solved within days of their occurrence, including the gang shooting at Paddock elevators where one suspect was located and arrested in Kentucky, a sexual assault case where the suspect was a gang affiliate wanted in connection with other sexual assaults in another state, and a multi-county burglary case where the suspect is now serving eleven years in prison.*

*Due to work by the Sheriff's Office and the Walla Walla Sheriff's Foundation, a second cross-trained patrol & narcotics detection K-9 team will be up and running by July of this year.*

*In 2016, Deputies Jeff Jackson and Kevan Gifford received Life-Saving Awards for locating a lost felony suspect on a freezing cold snowy night. In a separate incident, Sergeant Dale Preas, Deputy Jeff Jackson, and Deputy Robin Frisvold received commendations for their heroic actions after the pursuit of a stolen vehicle that caught fire in the Blue Mountains; the Deputies' quick thinking and firefighting efforts literally by hand prevented a major forest fire. Deputy Kristen Daschofsky earned and was awarded the WWSO's Deputy of the Year and was honored as Law Enforcement Officer of the Year by the Blue Mountain Masonic Lodge 13.*

*2016 also saw the selection of a new School Resource Officer at Walla Walla High School. By all accounts, our new SRO Deputy Allan Thonney is doing a great job and enjoying his work at Wa-Hi.*
