# SAFETY HEADSETS

*The Walla Walla Sheriff's Foundation purchased two safety and communication headsets. These headsets will be used to eliminate the risk of permanent hearing loss to the deputies. While wearing them the risk of career-ending hearing loss is greatly mitigated, allowing these law officers to continue serving our community.*

*Additionally, they will allow the deputies to effectively operate close to police vehicles, and utilize the dual-hearing control to drown out engine and siren noises, while at the same time amplifying the radio traffic, through the headset, for better communications.*
